## Message from the Principal

Dear DC Families,

I hope that your 2017 is off to a super start and that you are managing to stay warm during these chilly days. The students have all made a smooth transition back to school and everyone is working hard to SOAR in all aspects of life at school. Although we are only in January plans are already in motion to prepare for the 2017-18 school year. Kindergarten registration begins on January 23<sup>rd</sup> and information about Middle School programming has already been sent to Grade 5 families. Over the next few months our grade 5 students will have the opportunity to participate in a few transition activities to Spencer Middle School which will help them to feel comfortable and confident about next year. I will be sending additional information home to Grade 5 families about these opportunities once it is available.

On Monday, I spoke with the students about the importance of using their agenda on a daily basis to keep track of important school and personal information. I reviewed how I use my agenda to stay organized and would ask you to please check in with your son or daughter on a regular basis to ensure that he or she is indeed using the agenda. I also gave the students three things that they can do at home each day to help solidify some of the concepts covered in school. I suggested that they try to teach something that they learned during the day to a friend or family member. I also said that coming up with questions about the material they learned is also a very powerful way to connect with what is being taught at school. Finally I

reminded students about the importance of reading on a daily basis. Your support at home is greatly appreciated and has a huge impact on the educational experience of your child.

Once again I thank you all for your continued support and hope that you and your

family have a wonderful weekend.





Please Note: Registration after these dates will be subject to space availability in each school. Registrations will be processed in the order in which they are received and families are encouraged to register as soon as possible.


